- Licence-issuing authorities should take a proper trial before issuing a licence.
- CCTV cameras should be installed in proper locations, and anyone caught in rash driving should be given the punishment of social service or something.
- **Teenagers** below the age of 18 are not allowed to drive bikes or cars. But they violate the rules and come out with vehicles on the road.
