

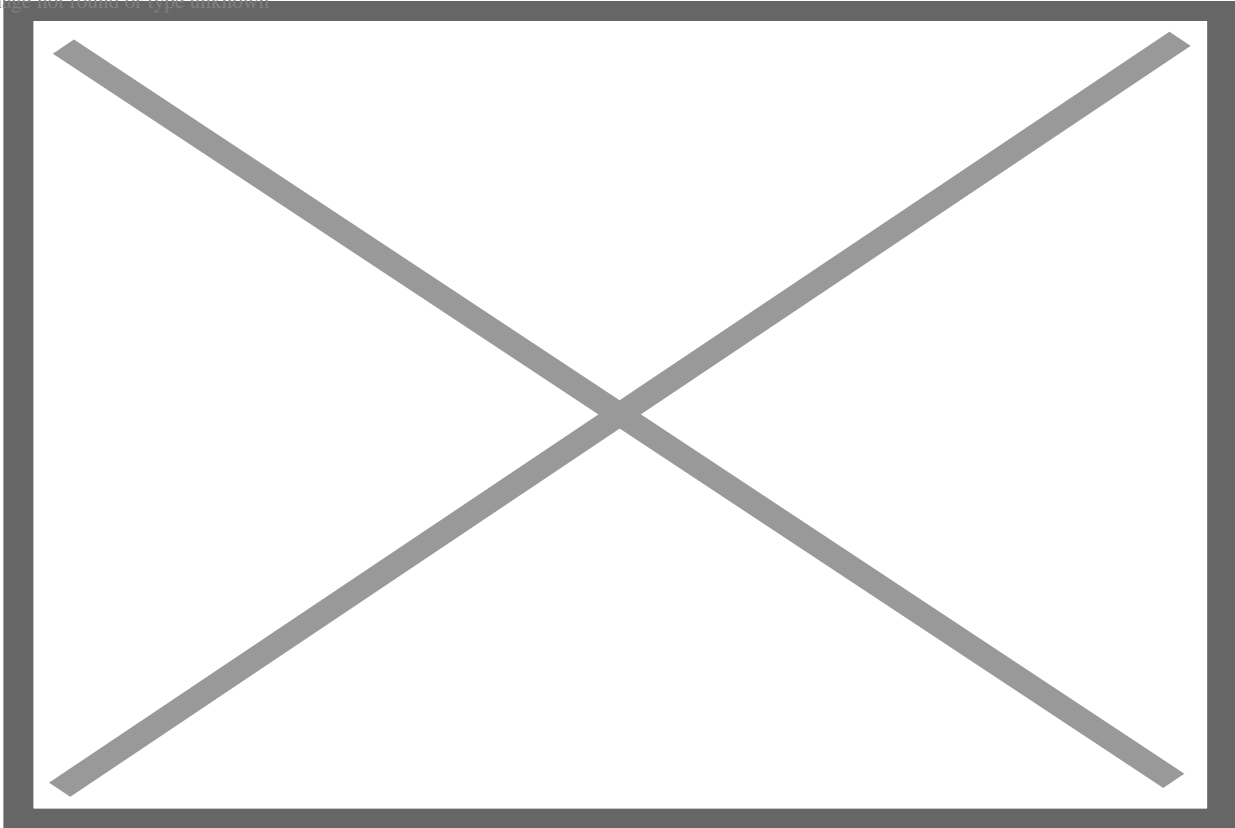
Joint Family vs Nuclear Family : 10 Pros and Cons

Growing Trend of Nuclear Families:

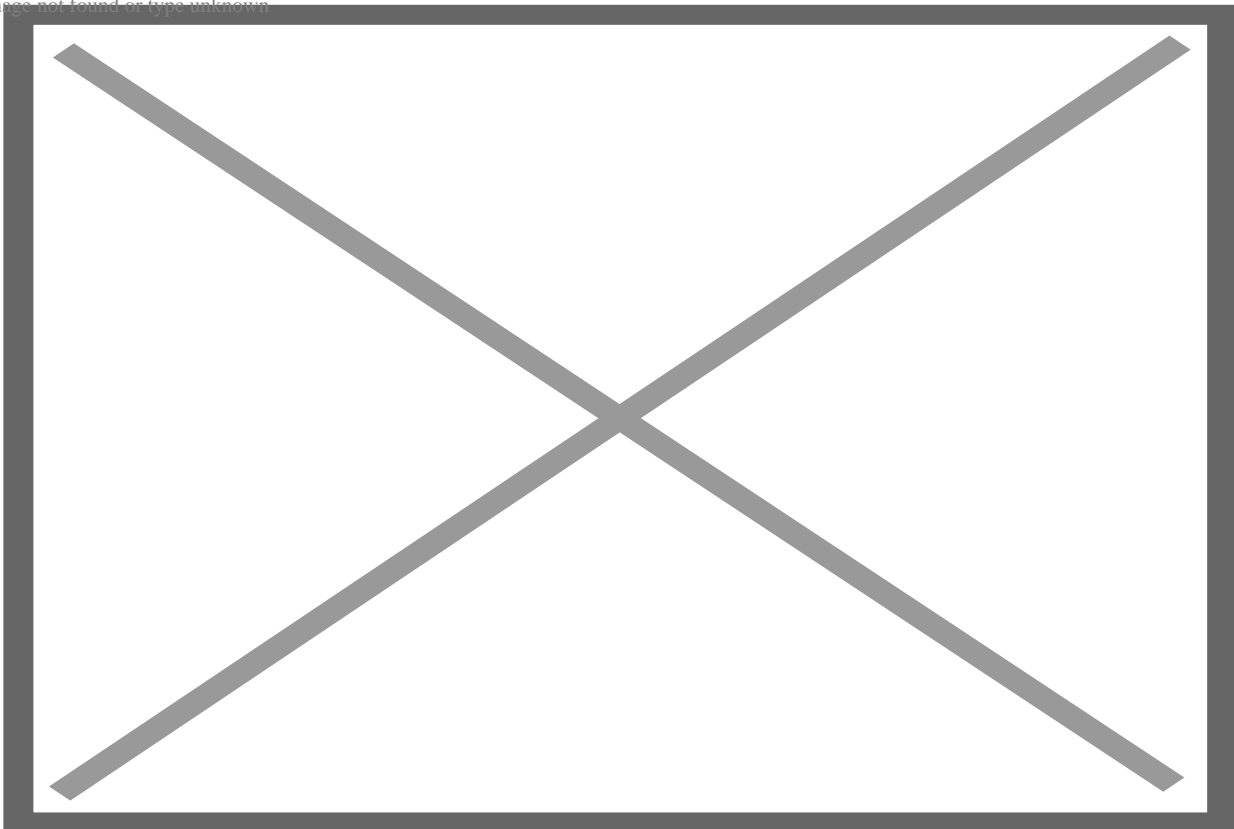

- A joint family lacks privacy. Anyone can use personal items or occupy personal space.

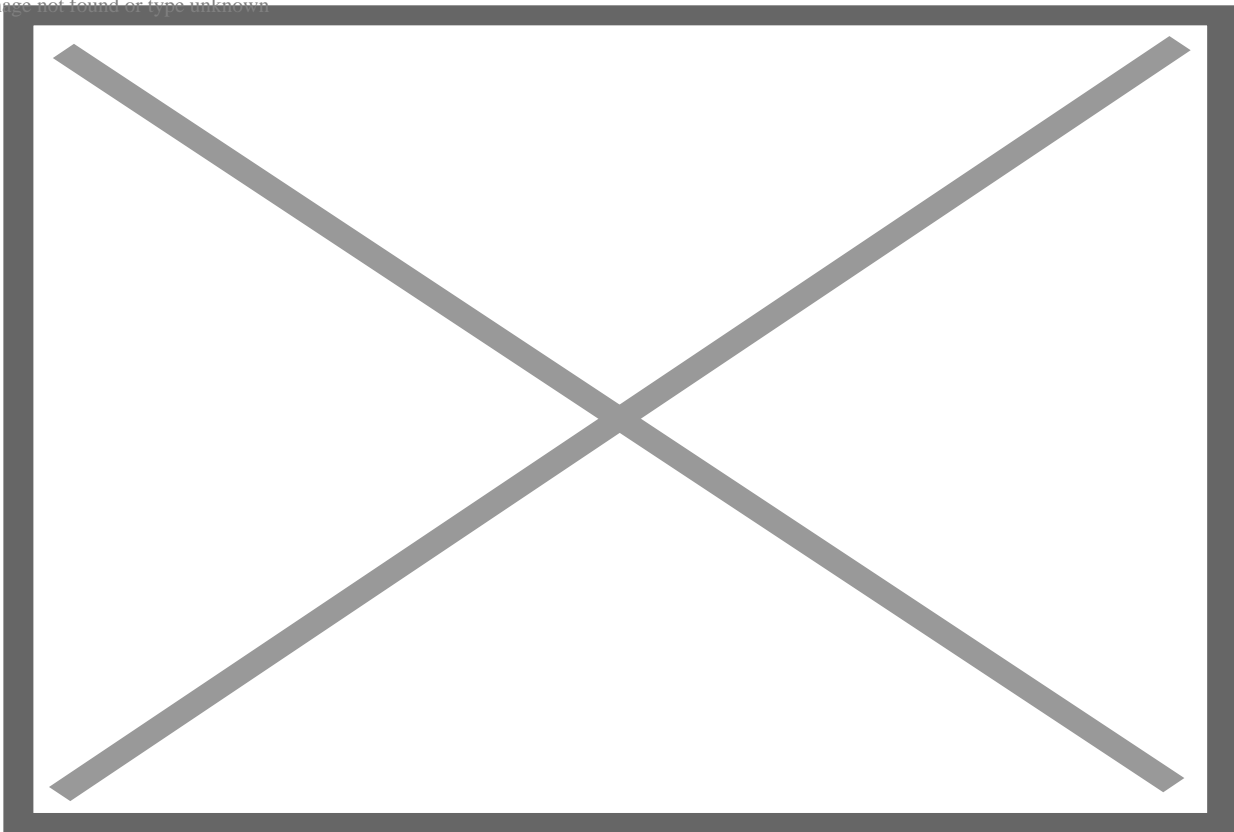
