3. Legal and constitutional issues

Supreme Court mandates "necessity and proportionality" for Aadhaar use; census halted NERPAP in 2015

4. Political sensitivities

Opposition parties accuse the EC of using linkage to manipulate voter rolls

5. Voluntariness vs de facto compulsion

Though law says voluntary, field pressures may make it mandatory for many
