# **Description**

#### Theme:

On 12th & 13th January 2023, India hosted a two-day virtual summit on "Voice of the Global South". Its theme was "Unity of Voice, Unity of Purpose." This was an attempt to build cooperation among the countries in the global south and to bring balance to the world order.

#### What is Global South:

• It refers to the nations <u>located in the southern part of the world</u>. This includes a total of 78 countries in the regions such as South America, Asia, Africa, and Oceania. The Global North refers to countries like the US, Canada, Europe, Russia, Australia, and New Zealand.

### Importance of the voice of the Global South summit:

- The Global South is significant due to its large population, which constitutes over 50% of the world's population, making it a significant demographic force in the world. The Global South is known for its diverse and rich cultural heritage, which contributes to the cultural richness and diversity of the world. The Global South is rich in natural resources, including minerals, oil, and forests, which play an important role in the world economy. But the region is under-represented in international forums.
- Many countries in the Global South are experiencing <u>rapid economic growth</u>, which is contributing to the world's economic development and stability.
- The Global South is <u>home to many emerging markets</u>, which are becoming increasingly important centres of innovation, entrepreneurship, and investment.

#### India as a leader of the Global South:

• India is one of the largest and most populous countries in the region and due to its <u>large</u> population, rich culture, and growing military and economic power, India has the potential to be a

leader of the Global South.

- Where the UN failed to effectively address the concerns of the Global South, <u>India is focusing on adjusting its relationship with other major powers</u>, ensuring peace and stability in its surrounding <u>regions</u>, and creating regional organizations in its extended neighbourhood to enhance cooperation and coordination.
- India's <u>policy of non-alignment</u> with any major power bloc in the world has positioned it well to take a leadership role in the Global South.

- <u>Developed nations have a lot of control over international trade and financial systems</u>. This control can cause harm to developing countries in the Global South.
